What is Maundy Thursday?

On this night we remember and celebrate the final supper Jesus shared with His disciples during Passover. At this “Last Supper”, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Communion and also issued a new commandment. The term ‘Maundy’ comes from the Latin word *mandatum* which means ‘commandment’. Jesus declared: “A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.” (John 13:34)

As we gather for worship this evening, we mark this occasion by reflecting on the full extent of Jesus’ love for us, as demonstrated in His suffering and death on the cross, and by sharing in the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper.

All those who trust Christ sincerely for salvation and who are members of evangelical churches are invited to partake of the elements as we celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord’s Supper. Children who have not yet made profession of faith and united with the church should refrain from taking the elements. Gluten-free bread is available within the special containers on each tray.
